us to cross the tens boundary. Following this unit, we will move on to 'Numbers to 1,000' which explores numbers and how numbers are composed such as there are ten tens in 100. Using known facts to make 100 as well as addition and subtraction across the ten's boundary.

We will also be focusing on timetables, recalling facts for the 2, 5 and 10 times tables. We will also be learning the 3 and 4 times tables. Every Friday, we will have a timetables activity to support the children with



	their quick recall of times table facts.  Mathematics homework is given out on a Friday and is due back in the following Friday.	
Science	In Science the children will explore: Rocks, Fossils and Soils. The children will compare and group together different kinds of rocks based on their appearance and simple physical properties. Once complete, they will gather, record, classify and present data in a variety of ways to help in answering questions and record findings	Encourage your child to look for rocks when out and about on a regular basis.
